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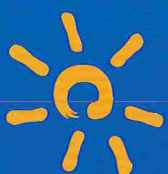

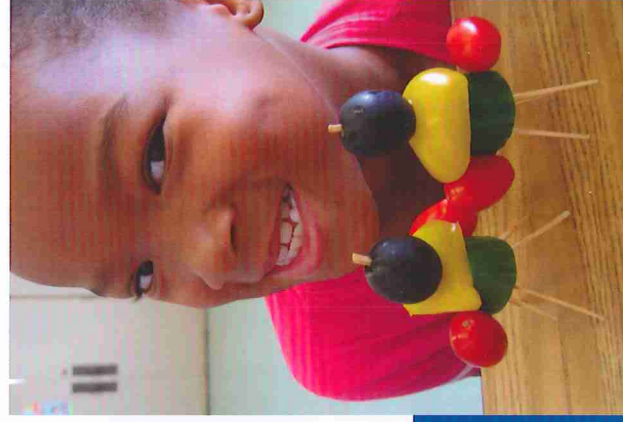
Building Brighter Futures and Stronger Communities

Afterschool Program

A large afterschool program for over 100 students of World Academy and Achieve Academy offers daily academic support and enrichment activities designed to reflect the interest and needs of our students. The program is open to all students on a first come, first serve basis. Afterschool activities reinforce student learning in the classrooms with student test scores that continue to rise.

Mental Health Services

Students of World Academy and Achieve Academy who experience behavioral, social and/or emotional challenges receive intervention services from a multi-disciplinary Family Support Team including staff from the schools, Hawthorne Family Resource Center and Children's Hospital Oakland.



Parent Center

This drop-in center offers assistance to parents and caregivers who are in need of resources and referrals (employment, housing, Medi-Cal/insurance enrollment assistance, etc.), basic and emergency needs (food, clothing, transportation, etc.), interpretation and translation services, and parent advocacy. The Parent Center also provides workshops, trainings, and coordination of school-wide family and parent events. We also provide free adult education classes in the morning. Limited childcare is offered. Open to the whole Fruitvale community.

Early Childhood Family School Readiness Program

This comprehensive program offers parents with infants, toddlers, and preschoolers an array of essential school readiness and educational support services including kindergarten readiness, peer to peer parent groups, parenting courses, parent/child play groups, and family literacy events. Open to the whole Fruitvale community.

Medical Clinic

Basic medical services: physical exams, vaccinations and immunizations, etc. Operated by La Clinica de la Raza. Open to children ages 3-18 in the Fruitvale community.

East Bay Agency for Children delivers a comprehensive suite of services empowering children, youth and families to be safe, healthy, and successful.

Our vital programs:

- Teach at-risk preschool through high school students the skills they need to manage the emotional and behavioral challenges that disrupt their learning
- Enhance student achievement through quality afterschool and parent-child school readiness activities
- Connect vulnerable families to available health, safety net, and social services
- Train children and adults how to protect against child assault, abuse and neglect
- Strengthen the well-being of children, families, and school communities experiencing loss, grief, life-threatening illness, trauma, and violence

Founded in 1952, East Bay Agency for Children serves nearly 20,000 children, youth, and families throughout Alameda County each year.
